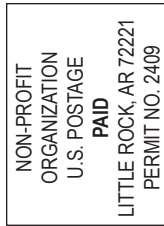
Hotel Accommodations - For those of you who will be coming from out of town, the closest hotel is the Holiday Inn Presidential Center. No special rate has been arranged.
